1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Welcome & Introductions

Mariel Higuerey, Director, Community Engagement, The Calgary Airport Authority started the meeting with a word of welcome and introduced the agenda

James Carr, Calgary Tower Manager for NAV Canada, was introduced as the guest speaker for the evening.

2. BUSINESS

2017 Quarter 2 Update – Mariel Higuerey

The Authority presented the operational data for the second quarter of the year (Q2 of 2017):

- The second quarter of the year experienced a majority of northerly winds, and overall aircraft direction followed wind flow
- Paving and rehabilitation work for runways 11/29 (crosswind) and 17R/35L (west) started in late May and concluded in July
- Summer maintenance on runway 17L/35R (east) took place in July.

Noise Monitor Terminal Updates - Mariel Higuerey

All of the 16 existing Noise Monitor Terminals (NMT) have been calibrated to record aircraft noise using the same parametres. The Authority placed the current NMT locations when the airport operated the Crosswind (11/29) and West (17R/35L) runways, so now we are looking to build the NMT network taking into consideration the parallel runway operations. Results on the preliminary analysis of the existing and potential locations were shared with the Committee.

Building the NMT network and upgrading the existing sites will be a gradual endeavor over several years. To cover some of the current noise monitoring gaps, the Authority will launch a roving monitor program in 2018. The program will be deployed annually from May to September, and each location will be monitored for a period of 4 weeks. Each year's roving monitor schedule will be shared with the Committee in the first ACCC meeting of the year before deployment.

Communities not accommodated by the existing NMT or the roving program can be covered by the Virtual Noise Monitor (VNM). The VNM is a computer model capable of providing an average depiction of aircraft noise based on flight tracks over a community. This model does not account for terrain or ambient noise.

Aircraft Noise Management Webpage - Mariel Higuerey

In an effort to make the aircraft noise management webpage easier to navigate, a new design was presented to the Committee for feedback and comments. The new web page organizes the various noise related topics in modules and includes notice and publications sections. The goal is to have the web page functional for October 2017.



NAV CANADA Update

James Carr of NAV CANADA presented an update on RNP usage explaining there has been a 41% increase in RNP approaches procedures at YYC period over period. However, this is still a relatively small portion of overall traffic for the airport.

Following the RNP update NAV CANADA addressed runway utilization and the proposed trial to respond to some of the communities' concerns:

- The trial's goal will be to improve the balance of departures of the 17L and 17R (south) runways over the weekends from 0700 to 2300
- The trial duration will be six months, starting in October 2017
- During the trial, primary departure runways will alternate between odd and even weekend days (East on odd weekend days; West on even weekend days)
- Community members must keep in mind exceptions will occur, as safety will always be the deciding factor in flight paths
- Arrivals will continue to take place on both runways during the trial period
- Notice and information for the trial will be published on the YYC website, and an update on operations will be shared with the Committee at the next ACCC meeting

Committee members mentioned other runway uses and procedures concerns, and Mr. Carr explained how some options aren't possible due to safety protocols and priority. Variations in aircraft operations will always occur due to the type of aircraft, weather, etc., with safety always being the deciding factor.

New Business

Mariel will attend the Independent Toronto Airspace Noise Review final presentation in mid-September and will report back to the committee at the next meeting.
