#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Meeting was called to order at 18:30.

### **Welcome & Introductions**

Jody Moseley, Senior Director, Communications and Stakeholder Relations, Calgary Airport Authority started the meeting with a word of welcome and took a moment to introduce the following guest speakers for the evening:

## **Approval of Agenda**

The Calgary Airport Authority (The Authority) introduced the agenda and order of business was accepted.

# 2. BUSINESS

#### Required Navigation Performance (RNP) Procedures – NAV CANADA

Bob Fiege of NAV CANADA provided a detailed presentation reporting on RNP <u>arrival</u> procedures that came in effect May 26, 2016. Swoosh diagrams of 24 hours of arrivals and departure traffic on a typical day were provided and discussed.

The amount of flights using the RNP arrival procedures has been as expected (~20 – 35 per day)

It was noted that each flight using the RNP approach eliminates 4 minutes of air time and allows the aircraft to be on very low or idle thrust, therefore, reducing noise by a considerable amount.

This RNP change also offers a number of operational benefits, including safety, increased efficiency, reduced carbon footprint, and reduced costs.

# Noise Monitoring - RWDI Inc.

Russ Lewis of RWDI Inc. provided an educational presentation focusing on the basic terminology and science of sound and vibration. The presenter explained in plain English how sound and vibration are measured, what A-weighted decibels [dBA] are and why are they used, principles of sound propagation, and frequency of sound.

Details were provided regarding the noise study being conducted by the Authority:

- Five mobile monitors will be deployed in various downwind leg locations where noise is a concern to residents, for a period of one month. There was discussion about selection of locations for placement.
- The existing Permanent Noise Monitor locations will be reviewed and some of the monitors will be relocated to better align with present day operations. To be discussed further at the next ACCC meeting.

# **Terms of Reference – Mariel Higuerey**

New objectives are being added to the Terms of Reference which will aid in refining the purpose of the ACCC Committee and supporting the effectiveness of ACCC meetings. Membership definition will be better defined and meetings are to be scheduled in advance, for the following year, to better prepare members ahead of time for each meeting. New Terms of Reference will be finalized by the end of July.

The following feedback and requests were received:

- Add presentations on the technical aspect of operations at YYC to help better understand how the airport operates
- Include innovation during one of the quarterly meetings (what are aircraft or engine manufacturers doing to reduce noise impact)
- Discuss plans for airport growth and changes to airspace
- Share information about what is going on at Calgary International Airport (YYC) and opportunities for community members to participate

- NAV CANADA will continue to review and assess how procedures are having an impact on communities in conjunction with noise measurements that will be taken and will report back at the following community meeting.
