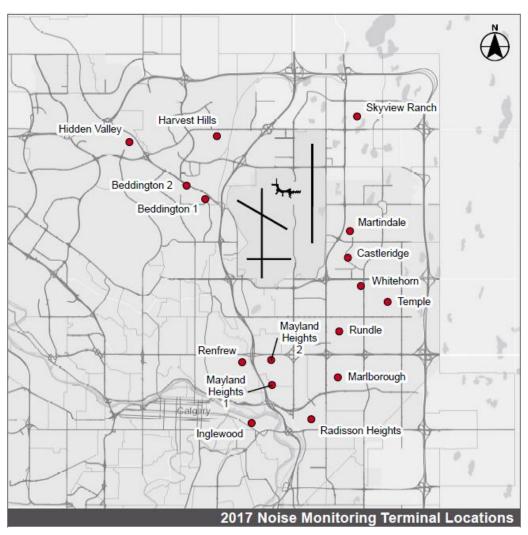

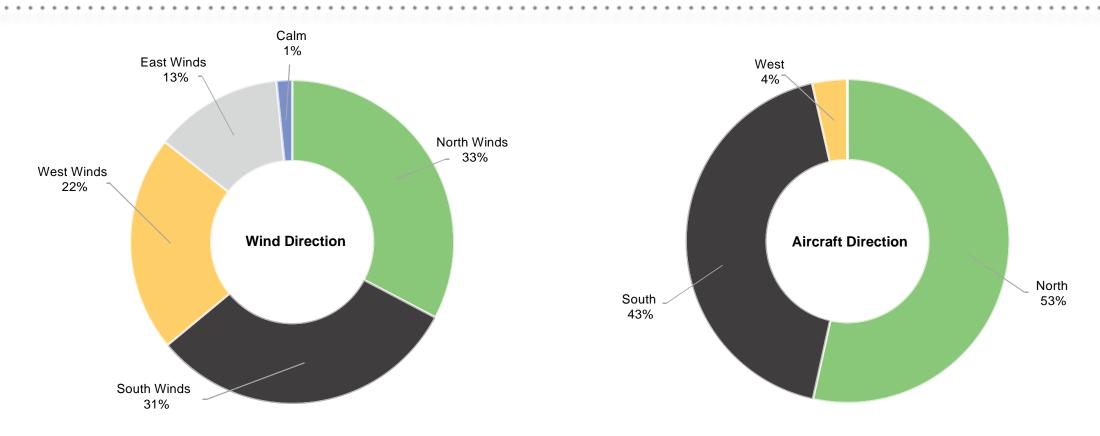

Operational Data: Runway Use

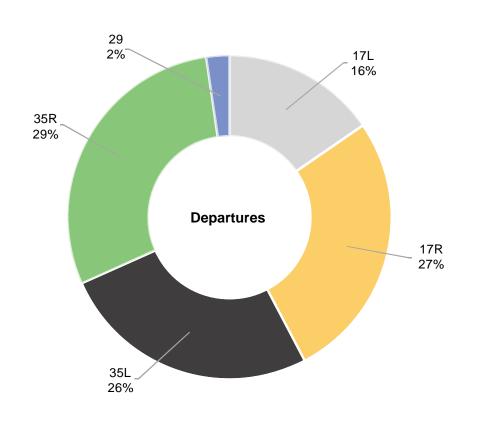


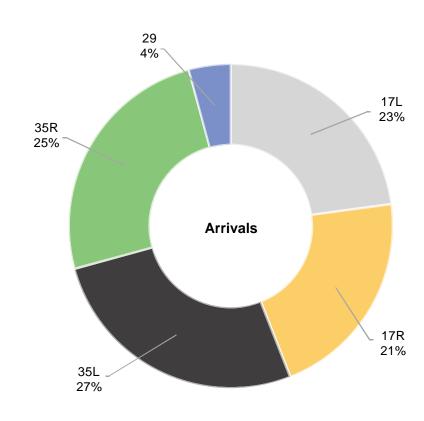


- 224,576 aircraft movements in 2017

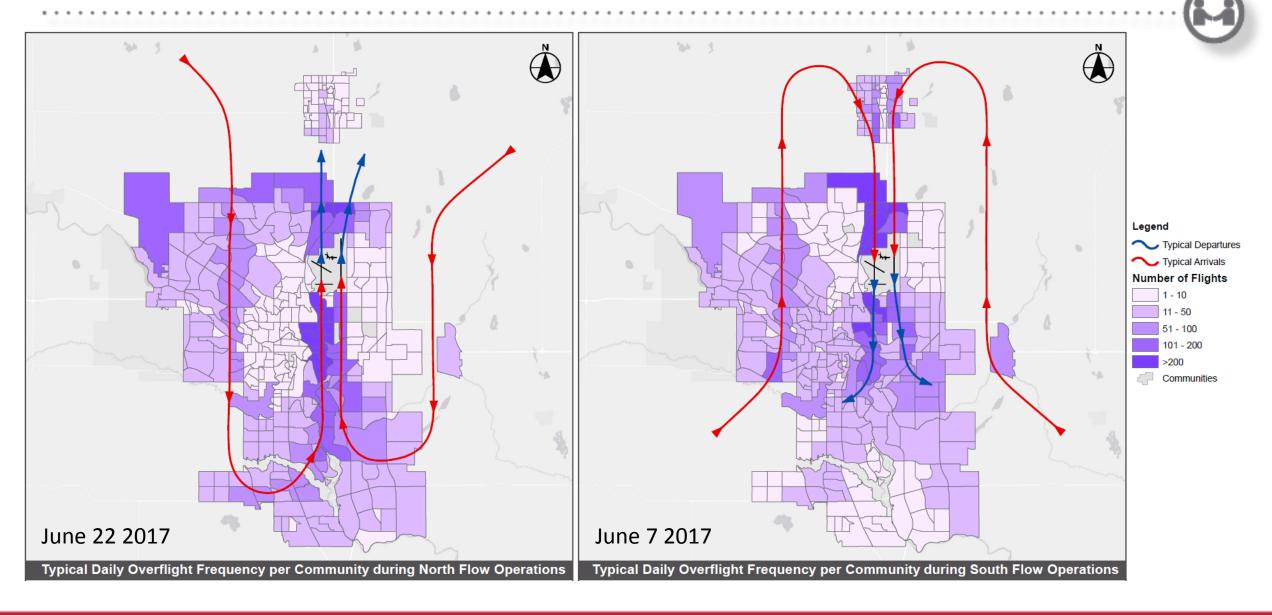






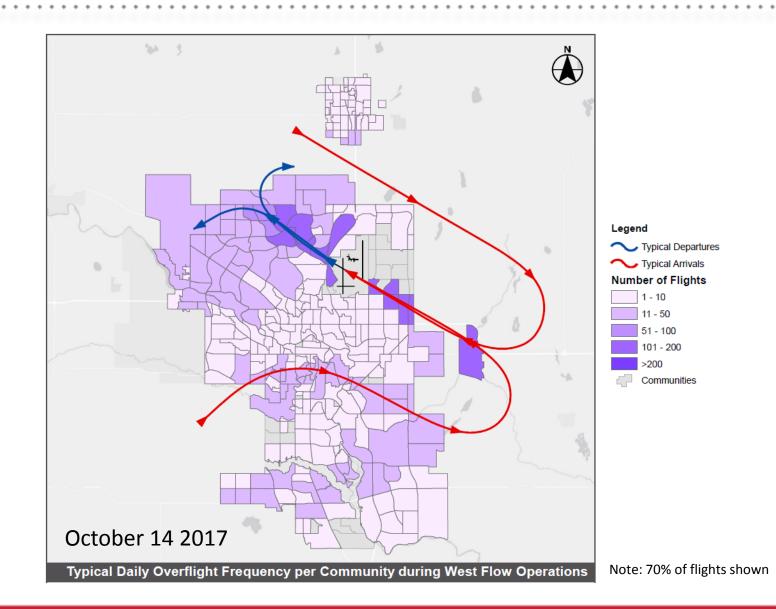
 Annual maintenance and pavement repairs spanned approximately 14 weekends from May until October

Operational Data: Flight Frequency



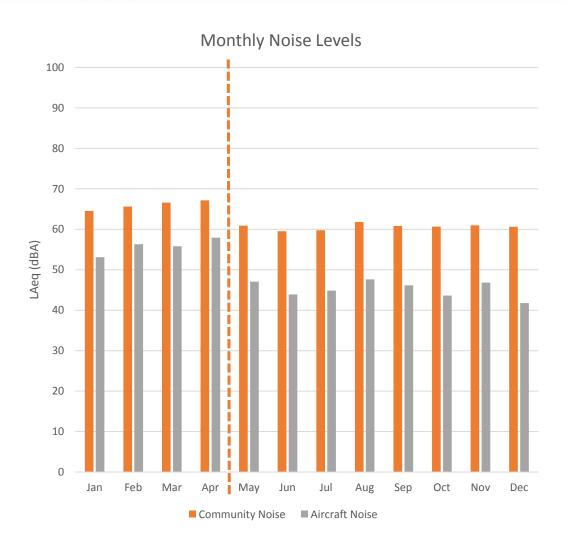

Noise Concerns



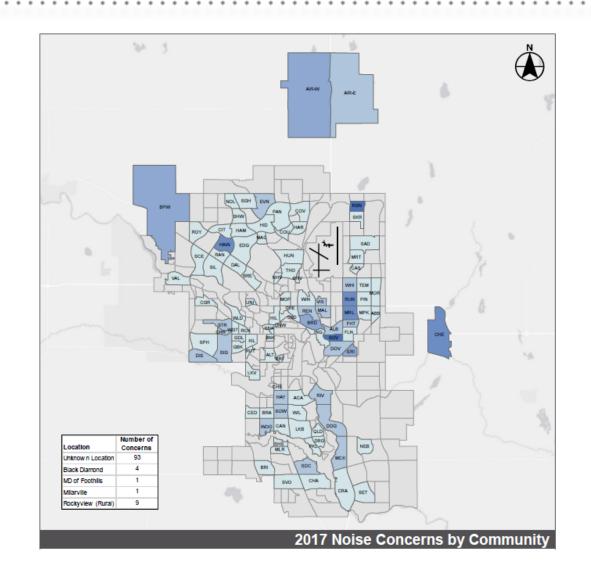


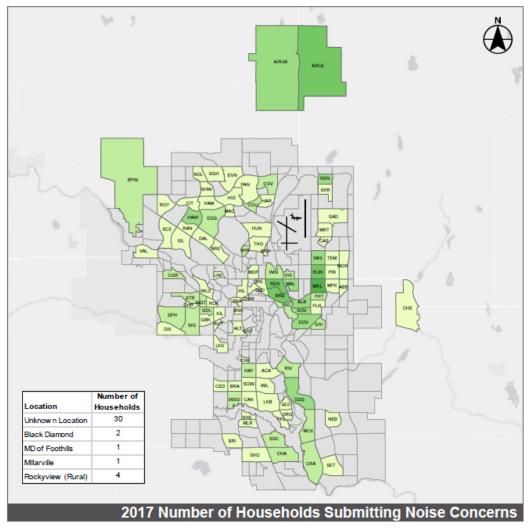


- Total # of concerns decreased by 11%

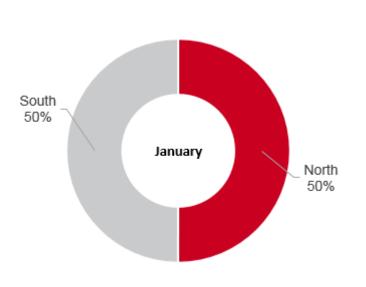


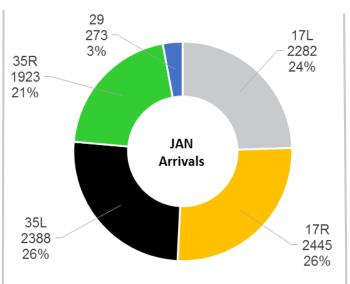


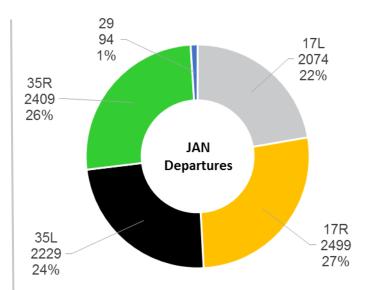
Typical winter conditions, more north flow operations

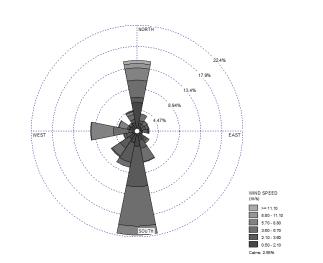

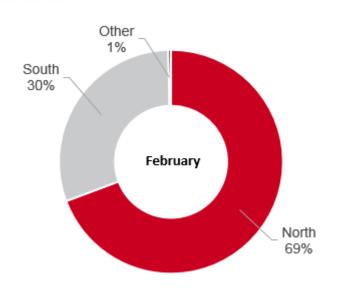


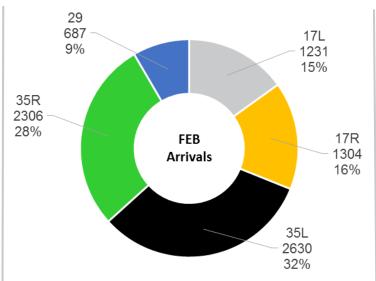


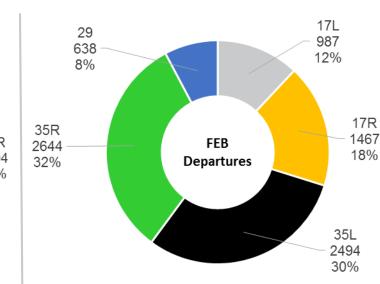
• Generally balanced use of all runways

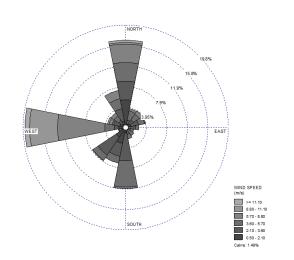
2018 Q1: February

Summary



Why?

 Improve the balance of aircraft departures of the southerly runways (17L and 17R) over the weekends without compromising safety

What?

- Alternating the use of our primary departure runway during non-peak traffic periods, when south flow operations are active between 6:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.:
 - The east runway (17L) odd weekend days
 - The west runway (17R) even weekend days

Out of the possible 42 days to date, only 21 days had the trial active

Next Steps



- Extend trial for a full year until Sunday, October 14, 2018
 - Warm winds from the south during Summer will likely mean more departures on 17L and 17R
 - Get better percentage of days on trial
- Evaluate the results
 - Runway utilization
 - Safety reports
 - Stakeholder feedback

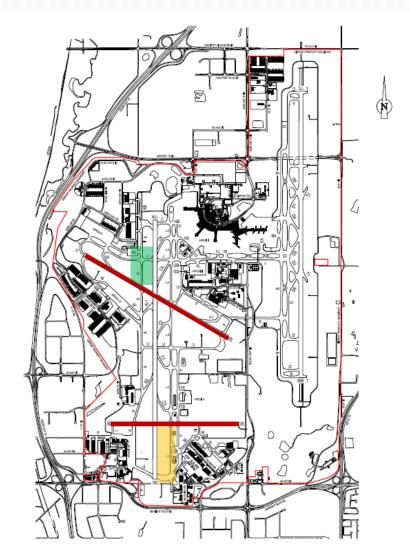
Taxi Alfa & Taxi Charlie



- Taxi A 11/29 runway closure (Crosswind)
 - One-weekend construction time

- Taxi C 8/26 runway closure
 Access to Runway 35L
 - Two-weekend construction time

 Construction will take place between May and June



NAV CANADA Procedures

Review Process





Review Process



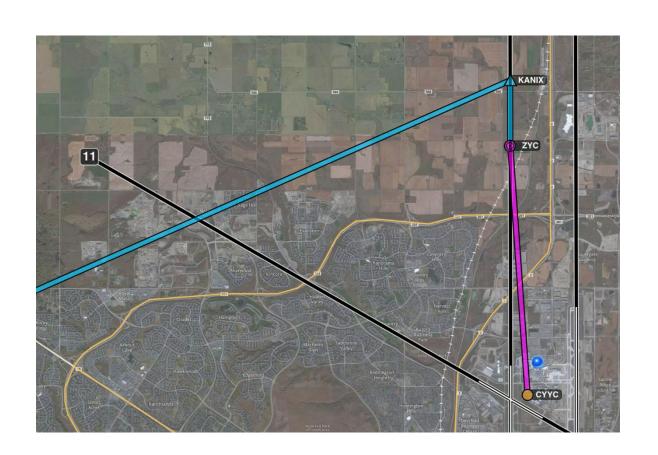
- NAV CANADA conducts regular audits to the existing departures and arrival procedures.
- Rescinding procedures that no longer meet criteria is a safety requirement.
- YYC, NAV CANADA and Airline Partners collaborate to look at options that minimize the community noise impacts.



UKSAP ONE & PIGEON TWO SIDs



- In a recent review two **Standard Instrument Departures** (SID) were found non-compliant.
- The two SIDs were used to direct traffic departing from runways 35 Right/Left and 29.
- Designed for night-time cargo departures and were used mainly by Metroliner aircraft.
- Utilization of the procedures was very low, with fewer than five aircraft, in total, per day using the procedures.
- These SIDs no longer meet Transport Canada design criteria (TP308) and, as a result, are scheduled to be revoked in September 2018.



NMT Updates





Equipment Status



- All noise monitors will be calibrated again in 2018
- We are evaluating new equipment options and developing a 5 year replacement plan.

Roving NMT Program



- Roving NMT program will run from May to September of each year.
- Each location will be monitored for 4-weeks (with on week of maintenance inbetween locations)
- The idea is to cover the existing permanent noise monitoring gaps:
 - Signal Hill
 - Hawkwood
 - Riverbend
 - East Airdrie
 - Chestermere (weather permitting)
- Next step is identify locations with the assistance of the Community Association and Committee Representative
