

Senior Signing Authority Information Guide

March 2024



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SENIOR SIGNING AUTHORITY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

As Senior Requesting Officer you have prime responsibility within your organization to ensure that individuals employed by, or providing a service to or on behalf of, your organization are complying with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and Calgary Airport Authority directives pertaining to airport restricted area access.

You assume financial liability on behalf of your organization for all fines, penalties and administrative charges levied by Transport Canada or the Calgary Airport Authority for failure by anyone under control of your organization to comply with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and Calgary Airport Authority directives, and “terms” pertaining to airport restricted area access.

As such, you are required to ensure that:

1. Anytime an employee leaves a company that the individual’s RAIC/Temp Pass and keys, if applicable, are returned to Pass Control immediately
2. Appropriate security measures are in place if your company is responsible for a restricted area access point

In accordance with the Calgary Airport Authority’s current policy, your company will be invoiced a non-refundable administrative fee of \$300 for the RAIC and \$25 for each key not returned in a timely fashion.

You may designate other individuals within your organization to assist you with this appointment; they will be Designated Requesting Officers. Unless the Calgary Airport Authority Security Manager is notified, in writing, of any restrictions, the signatures of your Designated Requesting Officers will have the same authority as your own. Your number of delegates is to be kept to an absolute minimum and you are responsible for the actions of all designates you appoint.

You shall ensure that:

1. You are familiar with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and those sections of the Transportation Security Clearance Program applicable to your position.
 2. Everyone employed by, or providing a service to or on behalf of, your organization for whom airport restricted area access is requested is aware of their responsibilities under the regulations and directives cited above.
 3. Current Certificates of Appointment for yourself and those who you’ve designated are on file in the Pass Control Office.

4. Each request for an airport restricted area access clearance, airport restricted area access pass, airport keys and airport access cards are signed by a duly appointed Authorizing Officer.
 5. Each request for an airport restricted area access pass, airport keys and access cards, is for the minimum access needed by the applicant to effectively carry out their duties.
 6. All airport restricted area passes, airport keys and access cards for which there is no longer an entitlement by the person to whom they were issued, are returned, within one working day, to the Pass Office.
 7. The Calgary Airport Authority Manager of Security is provided a record of the names of individuals to whom Airport Authority controlled door codes have been given, upon request

WHAT IS A DESIGNATED SIGNING AUTHORITY?

When needing to appoint a designated signing authority, they are required to complete the “Certificate of Appointment, Designated Requesting Officer” form which can be found on the YYC Pass Office website.

Once completed and signed, the designated personnel are allowed to book a 20-minute appointment with the Pass Office so we can collect the electronic signature.

After this has been completed, they are allowed to sign forms on behalf of the company.

Designate signing officers are required to understand the terms and conditions. They are listed below for your records.

IMPORTANT NOTE: PERSONAL INFORMATION ABOUT A COMPANY EMPLOYEE, WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT TO ANYONE FROM THE SAME COMPANY EXCEPT A SIGNING AUTHORITY; EITHER A SENIOR OR DELEGATE. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS.

DESIGNATED SIGNING AUTHORITY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

As a Designated Requesting Officer, you are responsible to your Senior Requesting Officer to ensure that individuals employed by or providing a service to or on behalf of your organization, are complying with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and Calgary Airport Authority directives pertaining to airport restricted area access.

Your Senior Requesting Officer has assumed financial liability on behalf of your organization for all fines, penalties and administrative charges levied by Transport Canada or the Calgary Airport Authority for failure, by anyone under control of your organization, to comply with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and Calgary Airport Authority directives, and “terms” pertaining to airport restricted area access.

Unless the Security Manager at the Calgary Airport Authority has been notified, in writing, by your Senior Requesting Officer of any restrictions, your signature will have the same authority as your Senior Requesting Officer’s signature. You will be responsible to your Senior Authorizing Officer for all your actions.

Your prime responsibility is to assist your Senior Requesting Officer in their role.

It is your duty to ensure that:

1. You are familiar with Canadian Aviation Security Regulations and those sections of the Transportation Security Clearance Program applicable to your position.
 2. You understand the responsibilities of your Senior Requesting Officer and the responsibilities they have given to you as their designate

FAILURE TO RETURN PROCESS FOR RAIC/TEMP BADGES

As a Senior Signing Authority, it is your duty to ensure the return of employee RAIC/temp badges to the Pass Office. If an employee will be away for 30 days or more, it is required for the employee to return their RAIC/temp badge.

If an employee has been let go or leaves their job, it is up to the Designated or Senior, to notify the Pass Office they are no longer employed with the company. The Pass Office will then void the RAIC/Temp Badge until it has been returned.

Every month, a monthly report is sent to the Senior Signing Authority, to confirm that the employees listed are still employed with the company, along with the expiry and key report.

Once a RAIC or Temp badge has been voided, the company has 5 business days before they receive a “failure to return” notice. A failure to return is a notice, stating that we have voided a RAIC, or Temp Badge and the Pass Office has not received it. There are penalties surrounding the failure to return a badge as these badges are Calgary Airport Authority Property.

One unaccounted badge could cost the company up to \$525. If a company has over \$1500 in outstanding invoices their Pass Office privileges will be revoked until the charges have been paid

PENALTY

Initial Action: Employer will receive an email stating that the employees RAIC must be returned to the Pass Control Office within 5 business days.

First Notice: A first notice will be sent to the Senior Signing authority, two weeks after the **Initial** email has been sent, if the RAIC/Temp badge has not been returned.

Second Notice: Will go out one week after **First** notice has gone out and RAIC/Temp badge is still outstanding.

Reminder Email/ Final Notice: Will go out a month after the **Second** notice.

Invoice: Must be paid within 45 days

**Please note, companies with an outstanding balance could potentially have all pass control privileges revoked. There will be a 25% administrative penalty that will be retained by the Calgary Airport Authority if the RAIC is returned within 7 days.*

RETURN RECEIPTS

When RAIC/Temp Badges/Keys are returned, the Pass Office will send a Return Receipt to the Senior Signing Authority to notify them that they have been returned. These receipts will be sent over email.



Transport Security Services (TSS) & Transport Canada Guide

TRANSPORT CANADA SECURITY CLEARANCE

A Transport Canada Security Clearance allows an individual to work at the airport. This application will ask the applicant for their information, residences, and activities from the last 5 years.

ID Badges are issued to those who do not need to enter NPS zones (Non-Passenger Screening), so applicants are not required to complete a Transport Canada Security Clearance Application.

UPDATES – WHAT IS TSS?

As of February 2024, all applications are now required to be completed through a system platform called Transportation Security Services or TSS. *You can find the TSS platform through the email you would have received from “TSS MODERNIZATION” or through the [TSS Government Website](#).*

Any Administrator or Signing authority of a company, must have valid security clearance to be able to use the TSS platform. If they do not, they are unable to use the platform.

There is a difference between Administrator and Signing Authority accounts, in TSS.

Administrator account: allows you to onboard applicants, resend invitation codes, designate another administrator (there can be more than one), cancel applications, make changes to company and employee information.

Signing Authority account: allows you to onboard applicants, resend invitation codes, designate other signing authorities, certify that an applicant needs preclearance, review a “share for review” application, and cancel applications.

1. The employee must get onboarded by the Administrator or Signing authority of the company.

It is important to inform your new employee that they will need to download an authenticator app and they must have it readily available when they're using TSS.

2. The employee will receive an email from TSS Modernization about creating an account, with an invitation code, which is listed in their onboarding email.
3. Once they have created their account, completed their application, signed, and uploaded their documents, they will have the option to send it for review or submit it to the Signing authority, to be certified. It is up to the company, to decide what they would like to do.
4. Once their application has been submitted, the Signing authority will be able to certify that the applicant needs preclearance.
5. Their application then is sent to the Pass Office for review.

The employee should NOT book an appointment with the Pass Office until they have received a “Verification Appointment” email or notification. Once they have, they can book an appointment and are required to bring all documents, IDs and YYC forms to their appointment.

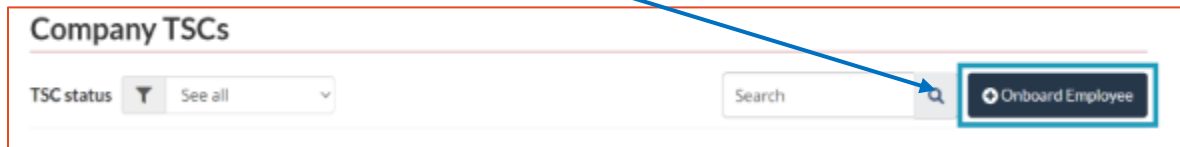
TSS – HOW TO ONBOARD AN EMPLOYEE

TSS - OCCUPATIONS

If you have put your employee's occupation as "OTHER –" you need to notify them that they need to put their title in the "Additional notes" section of their TSC. This section is located in the Summary tab of their Application.

English	Definitions (E)
Air Carrier Administrative Staff	Staff based at an airport or based at head office locations who, on occasion, require access to the sterile/restricted area. Staff examples include airport scheduling personnel, administrative assistants, Human Resources staff, payroll staff, marketing staff, data collection staff, communications and public relations staff.
Air Carrier Customer Service Agent	Staff responsibilities include checking in customers, boarding customers, helping customers (e.g. wheelchair assist, unaccompanied minors, etc.).
Air Carrier Security Management	Conduct operational oversight (e.g. ensure regulatory compliance, aircraft and employee internal investigations).
Air traffic controller/specialist	
Aircraft Fueller	Responsible for fueling an aircraft.
Aircraft Groomer / Cleaner	Groom the inside of an aircraft, conduct security spot checks, etc.
Aircraft Maintenance Technician	Conduct aircraft repairs (e.g. engine repairs, aircraft tray replacements, replace soiled set covers, etc.).

English	Definitions (E)
Aircraft Tower	Persons operating a tug, towing an aircraft.
Airport Customer Service Agent	Responsible for providing assistance and information to passengers or airport visitors.
Airport Maintenance	Personnel employed or contracted by aerodrome operators to provide maintenance (e.g. repairing, maintaining, or demolishing), cleaning or related services to the airport.
Airport Security Management	Personnel employed directly or indirectly by the aerodrome operator to manage the airport's security programs, plans, infrastructure and personnel.
Airport Security / Safety Personnel	Personnel that provide security/safety to the airport by patrolling duties within the air terminal building, airside or on the aerodrome perimeter or by conducting access control at restricted area access point.
Armed Guard	Armed guards (e.g. Brinks employees) engaged in the protection of persons and/or currency at an aerodrome.
Baggage Handler	Responsibilities include: loading the aircraft with cargo, baggage, removing and putting on bridge, towing the baggage to different gates.

English	Definitions (E)
Border Services Agent	Responsible for border and immigration enforcement and customs services at aerodromes in Canada.
Cargo Driver	Transport cargo from a cargo facility to the aircraft. Load cargo from a truck to the aircraft.
Catering Provisions Driver	Transport catering supplies from a catering facility to aircraft. Load catering supplies from a truck to the aircraft.
Contracted Airport Security Personnel	Personnel that provide access to the restricted area, within the air terminal building or airside access points.
CSIS employee	A CSIS officer engaged in undercover operations at an airport.
De-Icer	Persons responsible for de-icing an aircraft.
Emergency Response Provider	Emergency service providers such as: Firefighters, first point of contact Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT), Ambulance, paramedics, etc.
Escort Officer	Responsible for escorting persons to the boarding gate or accompanying them on a flight.
Explosives Detection Dog Handler	Handlers of dogs trained to detect explosives.
Flight Attendant	Crew member, who has been assigned duties to be performed in the interest of passengers (i.e. on board food and beverage service, assist passengers when on board an aircraft, etc.).

English	Definitions (E)
Inspector	Ensure compliance with Security Measures/Regulations.
Internal Auditor	Audit internal processes (throughout different departments: security, safety, etc.). Regulated by IATAs Operational Safety Audit.
Military Personnel	Military personnel responsible for transporting human remains.
Pass Control Office Personnel	Personnel employed directly or indirectly by the aerodrome operator to facilitate the issuance and control of passes that provide access to the restricted area of the aerodrome, keys, parking passes and driving permits.
Peace Officer	A member of the CSC who is designated as a peace officer, a member of the RCMP (police officer or constable), an escort officer (immigration), a military police peace officer, a person designated as a peace officer by the Minister of Public Safety, the Commissioner of the RCMP or a Provincial Minister as a peace officer for the protection of the public at an aerodrome.
Pilot	Complete responsibility and authority for the operation and safety of the aircraft during the flight, conducts mandated aircraft walk-around for maintenance issues, etc.

English	Definitions (E)
Retail Staff / Vendor	Personnel that provide retail and concessions within the confines of the aerodrome, either in the restricted or public areas (this includes restaurant staff).
Screening Authority Regional Manager	Oversee the delivery of screening services for CATSA at the airport.
Screening Authority Contractor Manager	Manage the delivery of screening services at screening checkpoints.
Screening Authority Headquarters Staff	Staff based at headquarters who, on occasion, require access to the sterile/restricted area. Examples include regulatory affairs staff, operations staff and program improvement staff.
Screening Officer	Screen passengers and their belongings, screen passengers checked baggage, screen non-passengers, their belongings and vehicles.
Snow Remover	Persons performing snow removal operations.
United States Preclearance Officer	Responsible for border and immigration enforcement and customs services at airports with preclearance facilities.
Wildlife Control	Persons responsible for preventing wildlife from threatening civil aviation.

TSS – EMPLOYEE ONBOARDING EMAIL

Do not send an employee the email link to TSS. Once you have onboarded them through the TSS platform, it will send them an email with instructions about how to set up their account.

An example of the email the employee receives is below:

Hi

Please sign-in to the Transportation Security Services (TSS) platform to complete your Transportation Security Clearance Application (TSCA).

To access your TSS account, you must complete 3 steps.

To get started, [go to your TSS account](#)

Step 1 - Sign in with GCKey or with Sign-in partner or Sign-up with GCKey

Step 2 - Choose and add your two-step verification

Step 3 - Enter your **invitation code**:

You need to enter **your invitation code the first time you log in only**.

Please access your TSS account as soon as possible, since **your invitation code expires in (4 days)**.

If you have questions, please contact your employer.

1. Your employee will need to make an account on TSS, as their GCKEY with the government will not work.
2. They must have an authenticator app to use the program.
3. The invitation code will be listed in the email they receive. **DO NOT** give out any codes you have received when building your own account, as this does not apply to the current applicant.

TSS – THE EMPLOYEES PROCESS

Inform your employee that is best to complete the application process through a desktop as the TSS website isn't formatted correctly on a tablet or phone. There is a readily available *Applicant Onboarding* document on the YYC website that explains this process.

1. Click on the website link in their TSS email they have received.

2. Click on "Sign up with GCKEY".

If they have a GCKEY with the CRA, this will not work for this system. They will need to create a new file, to use the TSS program.

1. Select "Sign Up"

3. Follow the prompts that the website gives them to set up their account; this is where they will create their security questions. To set up their authenticator, the following section will help them set up an account. They can use their phone, tablet, or laptop.

HOW TO SET UP AN AUTHENTICATOR WITH A MOBILE DEVICE

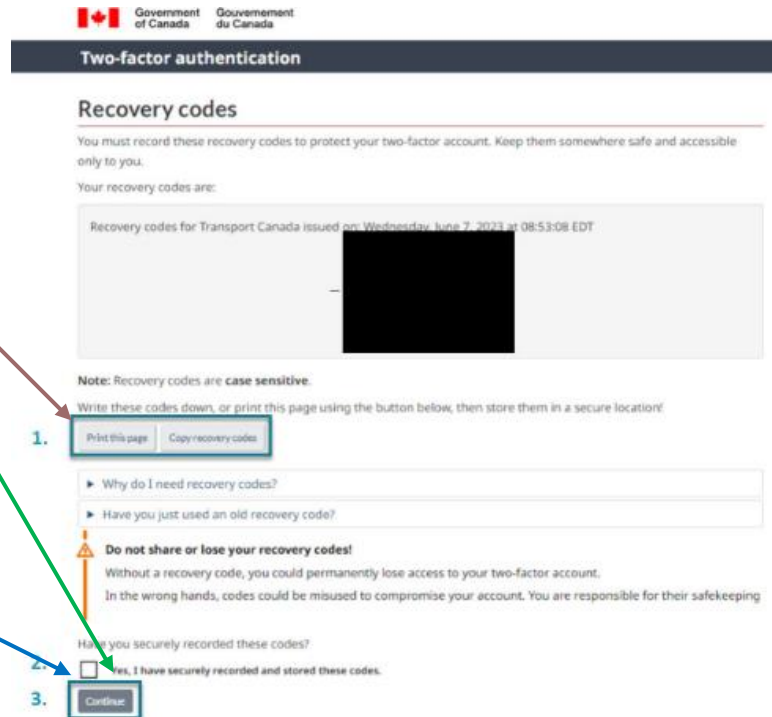

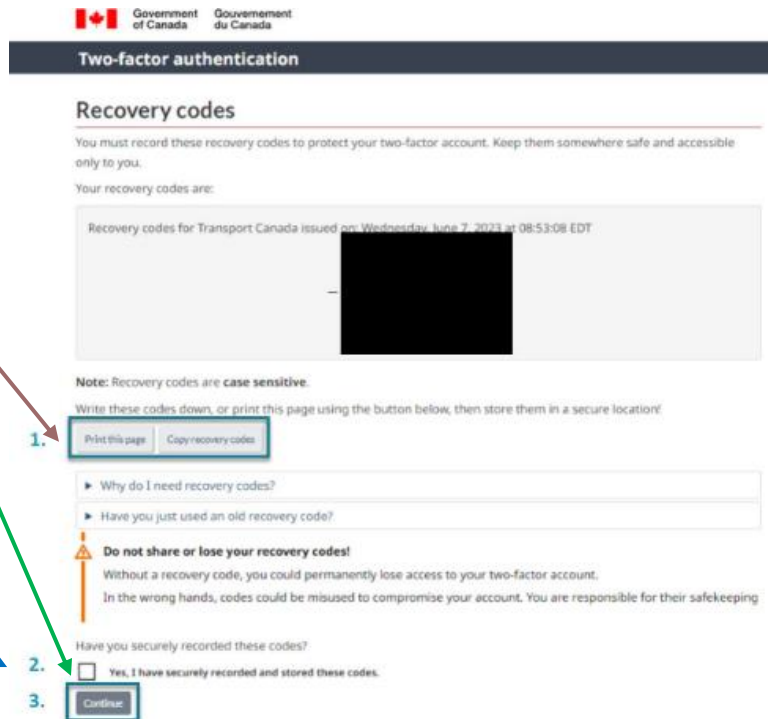

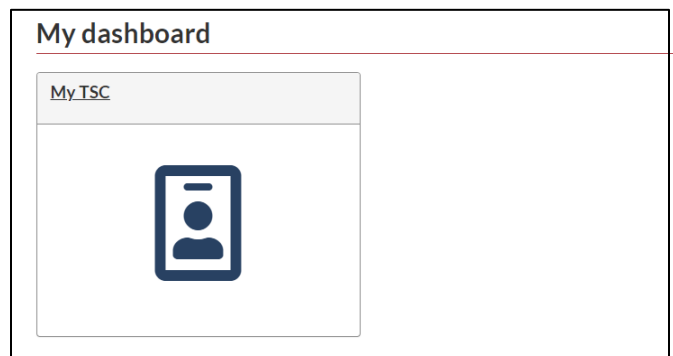
i The personal information enclosed in a Transportation Security Clearance Application is collected by or on behalf of Transport Canada and is only provided for the purpose of conducting all the necessary verifications or assessments for security clearances under the Transportation Security Clearance Program. This information is protected by the [Privacy Act](#) and shall not be used or disclosed for purposes other than those for which it was collected.

Use the 32-digit code listed in your TSS email.

Once the employee registers their account, it will prompt them to the TSS dashboard.

TSS – HOW AN EMPLOYEE CREATES AN APPLICATION

Once they are in their account, they must go to “MY DASHBOARD” from the top menu and select “MY TSC” to start their application.



APPLICATION SECTION

This part of the application requires them to fill out everything they have done in the last 5 years. This includes employment, unemployment, schooling, where they have lived, travel over 90 days and more.

They should NOT include documents that are not listed here, as they will be asked to remove them from their application.

In this section, they must “sign” each location the form directs them to. There will be no signature shown, just a number. This is how Transportation Canada confirms that they have used their account to sign the form.

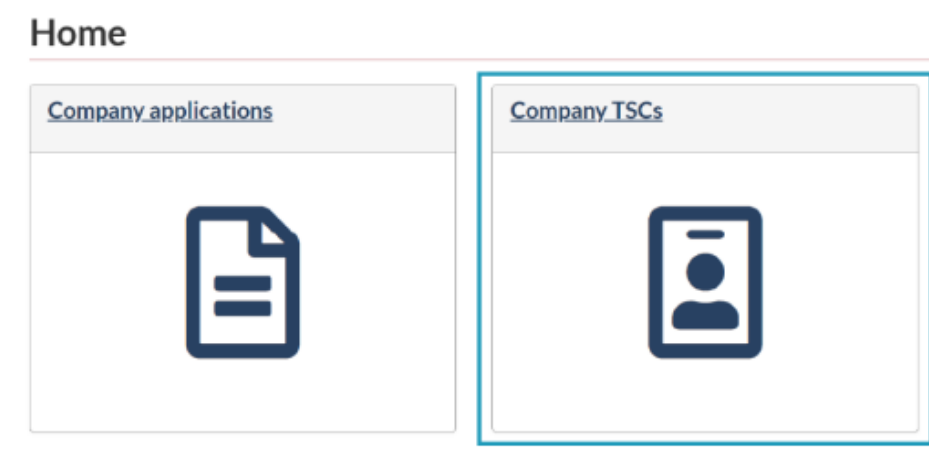
Once they have signed all necessary locations, they must submit it to the Enrollment Site or share to a signing authority for Review. If they have not submitted to the Enrollment Site, it does not get sent.

TSS – HOW TO RESEND AN INVITATION CODE

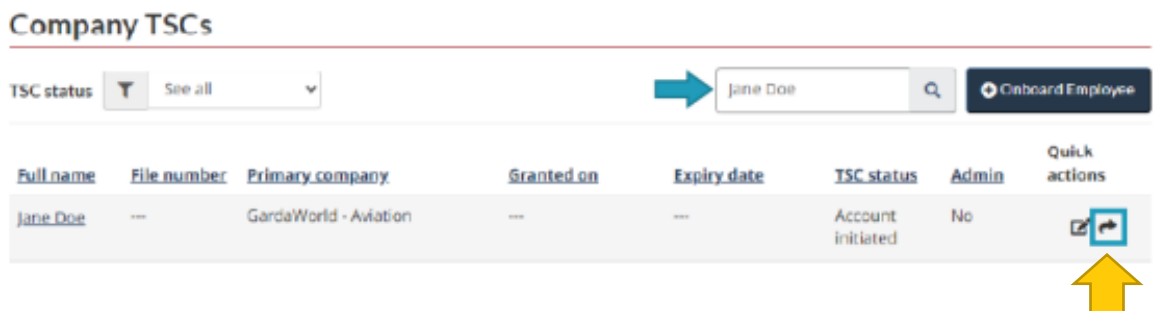
Applicants have 48-96 hours to create their account. If they do not set up their account within this time frame, the Administrator or Signing Authority must resend them an onboarding invitation code.

HOW TO RESEND AN INVITATION CODE

1. Go into “Company TSCs”



2. Search the applicant by their first name.



3. Once you have found the person you need to resend the invitation code to, select the quick arrow button to resend the invitation code.

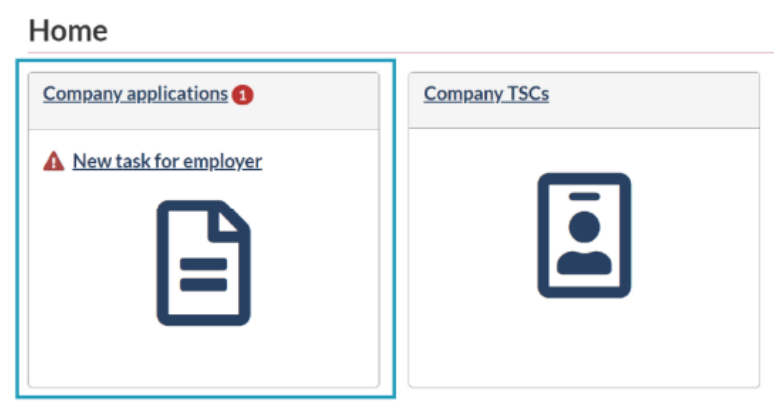
4. The TSS program will ask if you want to resend an invitation code, select “Resend”



TSS - CERTIFYING EMPLOYEES

Once an applicant completes their TSCA, uploads their documents and signs their application, the Signing Authority will be notified to certify an application. This means that the applicant needs a TSC for their job.

1. On the home screen, you will see a notification waiting for you in “Company Applications”.



2. Those that are listed “Action by Employer” mean that they must be Certified.

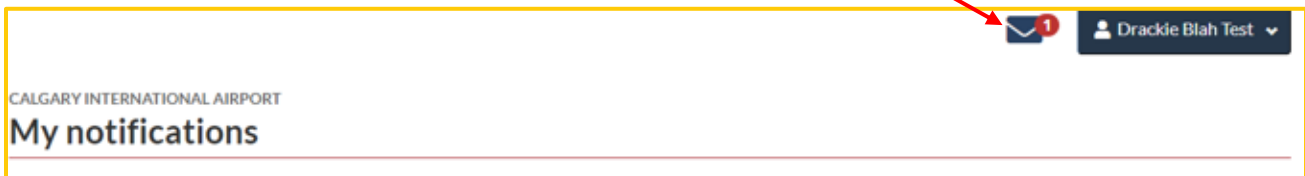

TSS – HOW AN EMPLOYEE COMPLETES A MODIFICATION REQUEST


It's important to understand that modifications can be completed within an employee's TSS account. No employee should be cancelling their application to create a new account. When the Pass Office requests modifications to any part of the employee's application, it is important to understand how the process works.

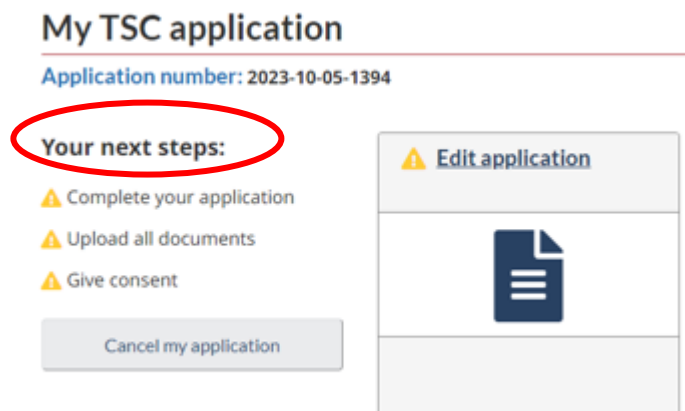
After the Enrollment Officer sends off the Modification request, they will receive an email right away from TSS, letting them know they have a message. They will be required to log into their TSS account to read the notification and see what modifications are being requested.



IMPORTANT NOTE: THE EMPLOYEE MUST MAKE NOTE OF WHAT MODIFICATIONS ARE BEING REQUESTED. IF THEY SEND BACK THE APPLICATION, WITH NO CHANGES, THE PASS OFFICE WILL SEND THE APPLICATION BACK TO THEM UNTIL THE MODIFICATIONS ARE COMPLETED.

Once they have made notes about what modifications are being requested, they must go back into their Dashboard, and select "My TSC".

In "My TSC", they will notice that their application has 3 alert signs ->  below under the "Your next steps" section.



MOST IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT MODIFICATIONS

They **must** go through each step (Application, Documents and Consent) individually, one after the other, before being able to move onto the next section, regardless of whether they need to make a correction in that section.

If they do not need to make any corrections in their **application**, they still must click on it, go into the summary tab, and click on “submit application”.

They **DO NOT** need to through each section of the menu to get to the summary page. Once it opens, the summary section will un-gray itself, allowing them to click on it.

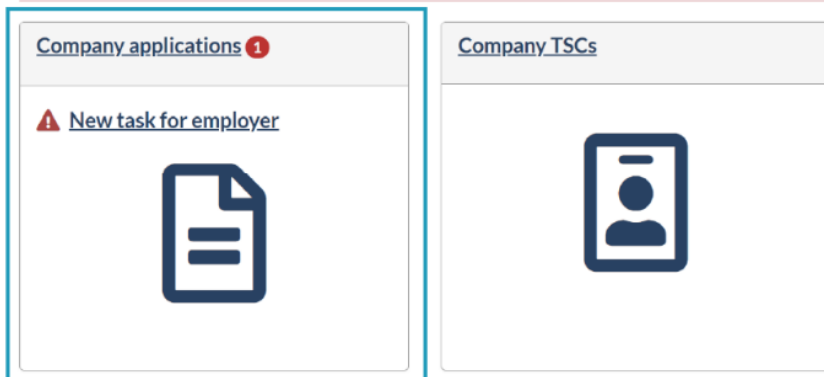

TSS – HOW TO CREATE A SIGNING AUTHORITY OR ADMIN


Through the TSS platform, you can designate or remove signing authority and admin power.

QUICK INFORMATION:

- Only those who have admin power, within a company, can designate another individual to become an admin.
- An individual can have both signing authority and admin power.
- To designate a signing authority, the person must have a security clearance.
- You must still inform the Pass Office if you are adding someone to become a registered signing authority at YYC, as those who have been given signing authority power through TSS, does not mean that they can sign YYC forms.
- If someone is to become a signing authority and has not been set up on the TSS platform, you must notify the Pass Office so we can give the information to TC.
- Those who are admin or signing authorities can designate someone to be a signing authority.
- Those who have out of city RAIC or CANADA passes, cannot become a signing authority in TSS, as they do not have a designated RAIC from YYC.

HOW TO DESIGNATE OR REMOVE

1. Go into the employees file through the “Company TSC” and click on the “**edit profile**” button.

TSS - FAQ

Do I need to onboard my entire company?

No, you just need to onboard new employees and employees who need to complete their Renewal.

Once the application has been sent to the Enrollment site, can my employee book an appointment with the Pass Office?

No. There will be a notification that is sent to the employee, if their application is good to go. This is called a Verification Appointment. They SHOULD NOT book an appointment with the Pass Office if they haven't received this message. This applies to modifications on applications as, as modifications mean there are specific things that need to be adjusted before they can book at the Pass Office.

How come I can't see all Signing Authorities in our Company section?

TC has made it mandatory for Company Signing Authorities and Administrators to have a security clearance. If you did not receive an invitation code from TSS Modernization, notify the Pass Office so we are able to send an invitation code or set you up as an employee to the company, to start your Security Clearance application.

Do I still need to notify the Pass Office when making someone a signing authority?

Although you can remove or add someone as an Administrator or Signing Authority in TSS with the click of a button, The Pass Office still requires a YYC Senior or designated form to be filled out. It's imperative to notify the Pass Office when there are changes to company signing authorities, as all information in the office needs to be updated.

My name or email is not listed in the employer section of their application.

Your name will auto populate when the application has been certified. The email address will not show on the application as you have signed it through your account profile, which has your email address.

I am a signing authority at YYC, and I was never given an email for TSS. What do I do?

No Security Clearance: *If you are a signing authority that is registered at YYC, and you have no TSC clearance, you would have not received an email from TSS. It is mandatory to have a transport Canada security clearance, to use the platform. If you do not have clearance, you will need to be onboard by someone in your company that is a signing authority and whom has clearances. You will need to apply for clearance and make an appointment with the Pass Office to submit your application and forms. Once you have received clearance, you can then have access to the TSS platform.*

Has security clearance, but the invitation code is not working: *Please reach out to the Pass Office, so a team member can send you another code through the TSS platform. This code is only valid for 4 days, so it must be used as soon as possible.*

Just became a Signing Authority and has clearance: *The Administrator of the Pass Office, should have received an email from a designated or senior of a company, to add this person as a signing authority of YYC. If you have not contacted the Administrator first, you must do so. The Administrator will notify you when they have been given the go ahead to book an appointment to complete an electronic signature and when their information has been sent to TC to be set up as a signing authority on TSS. If you haven't informed us, we cannot contact TC.*

Has Security clearance but has a different city RAIC: *Those who have clearance but have a RAIC that has not been printed at YYC, cannot have access to the TSS portal. The TSS portal can only be used for the designated airport, the clearance is located in.*

Someone from the company is being brought up to be a Signing Authority (who already has access to TSS - with clearance) or a signing authority has left the company; what needs to be completed on TSS?

If a signing authority of a company has left or has been brought on, the ADMIN or Signing authority of the company must find the person they want to remove or add. Under Company TSC, you must find the person. In their row, you will see two buttons under "Quick Action". You must select the one that says "EDIT" when placing your mouse over it. In the employees' profile, you will see that you can select or unselect ADMIN or Signing authority from their profile. You are still REQUIRED to notify the Pass Office when you remove or add someone as a signing authority as there is additional paperwork that must be completed.

The employee has sent up their account, but the site is asking for an invitation code. The one I have isn't working. What do I do?

*The employee should be onboarded through the TSS website. If they weren't, and you only provided them the link to the TSS platform, you are required to complete the onboarding process **FIRST**. The invitation code they will receive, will be in the email from TSS Modernization, **AFTER** you have onboarded them. Invitation codes are specific to **ONE** person and cannot be used multiple times.*

TSS – APPLICATION REQUESTED INFORMATION

CONTACT INFORMATION

- Client should be using an email address and phone number, they have access to and intend to keep as if Transport Canada has any questions, they will contact them on that email.
- A company phone number can be used i.e., HR's direct contact.

APPLICANT DETAILS

- Only use information found on Official documents, Birth Certificate, Landing Paper, PR, or Citizenship document.
- The Pass Office will only use the official information on the government issued ID.

NAME HISTORY

- Only use information that is found on official documentation.
- Certain countries do not require Surnames/Given names for the unwed.
- Detail all name changes, include changing back to a maiden name after separation or divorce.
- Applications or RAICS cannot be printed to reflect a middle name or assumed name.
- We cannot change any name in our system unless it was a legal name change and proper supporting documentation was submitted.

BIRTHPLACE OR CITIZENSHIP

- For those born outside of Canada, we require the following information on the Transport Canada application.
- Point of entry into Canada: The port first entered when receiving their landing papers.
- Date of Entry: The date they first arrived in Canada.
- For refugees select other and provide document information.
- Country of the passport is the country issuing the passport not the country where the passport was obtained.

CRIMINAL HISTORY

- Having a criminal history does not automatically prevent them from obtaining a TSC.
 - A review of their history is completed by RCMP and CSIS to verify accuracy.
 - Providing false information can result in refusal and a ban from apply for a TSC for at least 5 years.
-

EDUCATION

- Must provide information if they have completed School outside the last 5 years.
- Current Education from the last 5 years, must be listed.
- Make sure to include all Institution attended.

RESIDENCES (SECTION 35)

- Include all places that they have resided in the Past Five years.
- If they have maintained one residence for the entire time, they do not need to break up the stay at that residence; this will remain their primary residence.
- If they have multiple residences mark their primary as the residence where they received most of their mail
- If they have spent extended periods in other places or have worked outside of the city of their primary residence, make sure to include all locations that were stayed at.

ACTIVITIES (SECTION 36)

- Include all education, employment, volunteer work, and unemployment in this section.
- If unemployed use home address of the time for the work address
- If moved while unemployed, stop one block of unemployment and start a new block with the updated address.
- If working remotely the address of the company does not need to match the address of residence.
- If off during the summer months and not employed, this must be broken down and have unemployed during those months.
- If out of country for more than 6 months, please indicate this in activities.

TRAVEL (SECTION 37)

- Only to include travel of over 90 days consecutively
 - If travel occurred 90-6 months, please input this into Section 37.
 - Travel over 6 months should be placed in section 35 and 35 (Residences and Activities, respectfully)
 - Travel to US not required.
 - Living in the US not required here but still must be included in the Resident section of the Transport Canada Application
 - If travel occurred before the age of 16, or before the applicant had applied for Permanent Residency extra documentation is not required.
 - If travel occurred before first PR/landing papers application submitted, it needs to appear in the travel section, but no extra documentation is required.
 - If client was out of the country but not a PR, travel does not need to be completed in this section.

OUT OF COUNTRY INFORMATION

TRAVEL – UNDER 24 MONTHS

For travel 6 months to 2 years, additional documentation must be added to the applicant's application:

Travel from 6-24 Months

- Police Certificate
- Statement of activities

TRAVEL – 24 MONTHS OR MORE

Travel from 24 Months & Beyond

- Police certificate
- Statement of activities
- Documents to support residency.
- Documents to support employment, education and/or activities.

All supporting documents must be translated in French or English, and original documents should be submitted

TC - BULLETIN 85

When applicants have been advised that their application was denied under Bulletin 85, this means that the applicants OUT OF COUNTRY documents were not sufficient, and they are required to apply again. The applicant will receive an email or general mail from Transport Canada with the information that wasn't included in their application, before the Pass Office gets notified.

At the time of the Pass Office receiving the letter of the TC Suspension, the applicants Temp Badge will be voided, a letter will go out to the Senior Signing Authority and the applicant will be required to reapply. Reapply requires the same forms as a New Enrollment.

FOREIGN NATIONALS

As per the guidelines set down by the Transportation Canada Security Clearance program, foreign nationals are required to submit a letter of non-threat.

II.6 Foreign Nationals

The following documentation must accompany the application.

1) A certificate signed by an official of the foreign government, foreign air carrier or foreign company stating that:

a) the applicant is an employee of the government, air carrier or company; and

b) the applicant's presence in the restricted area will not constitute a threat to transportation security.

2) Documentation issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada indicating that the applicant complies with the requirements of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations.

3) A photo-bearing identification document issued by the company or government concerned.

4) Where applicable a letter of introduction signed by an official of the foreign manufacturer to the client Canadian air carrier stating that:

a) the applicant is a representative of the foreign manufacturer; and

b) the customary reliability checks of the applicant were conducted by the foreign manufacturer.

5) Where applicable a letter from the Canadian air carrier attesting that the representative's presence in the restricted area is necessary to meet the conditions of after sales service and stating the expiry date of the service agreement.

Where applicable a certificate signed by an official of the Canadian air carrier stating that the foreign national has been directly employed by the Canadian air carrier or by the foreign company for the previous five years.



Pass Office Guide

TYPES OF APPOINTMENTS AT THE PASS OFFICE & PARKING POLICY

All appointments must be booked [online](#). We will not book in person, on the phone, or by email.

We have different appointments for different actions in the Pass Office. Help your employees book the right one. We may not have the time to complete everything requested based on the appointment booked.

Turn Away - If a client is late 5 minutes or more to their appointment, we will still talk with the applicant if they show up within appointment time. We will then mark them as a TURN AWAY.

No Show - If they are late, arriving after the scheduled time of their appointment, they will need to pay a NO-SHOW fee of \$50 before we can process them on their next scheduled appointment.

20 Minute - RAIC/ID badge appointments should be booked for the following:

- Print or reprint RAIC or Change/Add Employer
- Extend Temp Badge (*clearance has not arrived*)
- Renewal of ID Badge or Print an ID Badge
- Adjust Parking
- Airport Transfers
- Issuing Keys
- Submit Canada Pass Application (can be submitted over email as well)

20 Minute - Visitor Pass Audit appointments should be booked for the following:

- Must be completed every 3 months and all certificates must be brought to the appointment.
- If you are completing an audit
- If you are picking up passes
- If you need more certificates.

30 Minute - New Enrollment appointments should be booked for the following:

These appointments are designed to be able to submit AFIS, record information and print a badge.

- New Enrollment (*Applying or reapplying to Transport Canada*)
 - Bulletin 85

30 Minute - Renewal appointments should be booked:

- Those who's clearance is expiring within 6 months.

40 Minute - New Enrollment – Out of Country appointments should be booked:

- Those who have out of country documents.

Parking Policy

- We can validate an applicant's parking if they currently do not have employee parking at the airport.
 - When the applicant's clearance has arrived, they are REQUIRED to park in the lot that is designated to them.
 - If an applicant does not have employee parking at the airport, we can validate their parking.

REQUIRED FORMS AS PER APPOINTMENT TYPE

Each Appointment can be different so specific forms must be submitted at your employee's appointment. As part of your role, you are REQUIRED to inform your employee of what appointment they must book and what forms they must bring to their appointment.

All forms can be found on the YYC website under Calgary Airport Authority -> Pass Office.

AT THE TIME OF APPOINTMENT

For all New Enrollments (looking to obtain a Transport Canada Security Clearance) or Renewal, all employees are required to bring in the information that has been requested of them from Transport Canada and the list provided as per appointment type.

We cannot complete the appointment with all required documents, IDS and forms brought to the appointment.

The Pass Office is unable to photocopy or send a document that was not submitted into their application. Modifications may be requested but may not be complete at the time of their appointment.

AFTER APPLYING

Temp Badges - Temp badges are only issued once a Transport Canada Security Clearance Application has been sent. Temp badges contain two cards and are only valid for 6 months. It is important to always keep both cards on you as losing one card will still be considered losing your entire badge.

Clearance Time Frame - Clearance generally takes 6 months to up until a year to become approved by Transport Canada. The Pass Office has no say in what clearances get pushed first, but it is entirely up to Transport Canada of how long it takes to get approval.

Clearance Arrival - When clearances arrive, **we notify the Senior signing authority**, and inform them that they can tell their employee that they can book a 20-minute appointment at the Pass Office. We do not inform applicants over the phone, email or in person when their clearance arrives. This duty is on the Senior signing authority to delegate the information to your designated or to the applicants themselves.

Senior or designated signing authorities can ask on behalf of their employees to see if clearance has arrived, but please know that some clearances do take some time to become approved. The rate of requests from signing authorities has recently increased (since 2023) regarding employee's clearances, please understand that there

are currently 18,000 active employees at the airport. It is the importance of the Senior Signing authority to relay any information from the Pass Office to their designates.

At the Pass Office, we do not pre-print RAIC badges, but they are printed, encoded, and tested at the applicant's appointment. The badges are encoded with the applicants' biometrics so their identity can be confirmed at all NPS zones.

Expired Badges - If the applicants Temp Badge/RAIC/ID badge has expired, we required a RAIC or ID Badge form, to be filled out (indicating that the employee is still working with the company), so we are able to print out a new badge.

Extensions on Clearance - Transport Canada does not create extensions. In the past, clearances were printed out, 4 to 6 months before the expiration date of the applicant's clearance. This is no longer in practice and all RAICs are printed out to the last day of their clearance.

We cannot print out additional clearance if a RAIC has expired; the applicant will need to submit a Transport Canada Security Clearance application first before we can print out a Temp badge.

CASAP (CANADIAN AIRPORT SECURITY AWARENESS PROGRAM)

For those applying for a Transport Canada Application, there are [2 CASAP modules](#) that must be completed at the time of their appointment:

- National Module
- YYC Security Awareness Module (*also includes an Active Shooter portion*)

Both courses are mandatory for the following:

- New Enrollment
- Renewal
- A return to work after 6 months away from the Airport
- Transfer from another Airport.

Make sure these are completed before your employee's appointment date.

The validity date of these modules are **6 months**. After 6 months, the employee must complete the modules again. This standard is set and implemented by YYC Security and Calgary Airport Authority.

For those who do not require a Transport Canada Security Clearance, and only require and **ID badge**, they are only required to complete the YYC Security Awareness CASAP module.

The employee must have a valid Transport Security Clearance (RAIC) to hold Visitor Passes; using a temp badge is not allowed.

Reminder emails will be sent 10 days before audit is due. These are automated messages. If you get your audit done early these messages will still come 10 days before original audit day.

Visitor Passes are good for 1 year

Certificates (Blue and Yellow) are audited every 3 months. Certificates are only valid for 24 hours only

To provide an easy audit experience, please ensure that all Certificates are in numerical order, and stapled together

You must submit a new visitor pass application for us to issue you new visitor passes, as these need to be preapproved
