1. YYC UPDATE: TERMINAL AND AIRFIELD OPERATIONS Dionne Crutchley, YYC

COMMUNITY FEEDBACK:

- Single use plastics ban it's challenging to find water fountains and by default, a guest must buy water bottles. Can you add more water fountains post-security or make the signage and wayfinding clearer? YYC will investigate further.
- Laptop charging ports in concourses D and E seating pods Several are not working. **YYC will investigate further.**

3. ROUND-TABLE

What percentage of alternate cargo departures are done at night? Is it significant going over Renfrew?

• There are no significant nighttime alternate departures. YYC has three to four departures per hour between 4 and 5 a.m.

Will there be new taxiways as part of the West Runway Rehabilitation project?

New taxiways are not part of the project.

Will there be a next round of consultations or post-consultation within surrounding communities?

NAV CANADA will be looking at the implementation of the change to ensure that
it is consistent with the consultation. NAV CANADA will report on the process and
make it available to everyone.

Where is the Marlborough noise data?

• Someone backed into the noise monitor in the Marlborough community. The Authority is getting it back up as guickly as possible.

Marlborough residents shared that the noise is not too bad, except between 10 p.m. and midnight in the last few months. Can you explain?

• There have been no changes to air traffic patterns during those times. After two years of minimal air traffic, YYC went from 5 per cent to 90 per cent of its operations by the end of 2022. In 2023, YYC anticipates a 90 to 95 per cent recovery with close to 2019 passenger numbers; which is approximately 17 million passengers forecasted for the year. YYC will investigate further.
