




Concourse B Restoration

- Full replacement of 60,000 square feet of roof













West Runway Rehabilitation Project Update

Progress and key milestones

A look back...

Scope of the Project

Restoration of West Runway

Complete a full rehabilitation of the west runway pavement structure and visual aids to ensure it meets modern safety standards as well as passenger and cargo needs.

Enhance Safety Measures

Improve the runway's surface, infrastructure lighting and electrical systems to significantly enhance safety for aircraft operations.

Prolong Service Life

This work will extend the runway's operational life, reducing the need for frequent and costly repairs.

Commitment to Sustainability

Materials like crushed concrete from the old pavement will be reused, and milled asphalt will be recycled for this and future projects. Additionally, enhancements to the storm management system will better address severe weather and reduce environmental impact around the facility.






PHASE 8 – Sep to Nov 2025

Application has been submitted for review.






Runway 11 Changes – New Transition



Blue lines are present arrivals
Red line is new proposed
transition to final approach on
RWY 11

This is when we are in East-West configuration (not common)


Runway 11 Changes – New Transition – Why?



Blue lines are present arrivals

Red line is new proposed transition to final approach on RWY 11

White lines are Springbank Traffic




Runway 17 Changes – Slight STAR relocation

Blue lines are present arrivals
Yellow line is new STAR
Purple line is path of early jet turns of departures

Will alleviate potential confliction point between arrivals and departures when wind pushes departures east.

Overflies fewer homes in the Chestermere area



Runway 17 Changes –STAR relocation – Why?

Aims to put arrival aircraft over the highway rather than over homes.

Saves track miles for our customers producing fewer emissions.


Eases decision making for operational staff.

Aircraft will be at 10,000' ASL, or ~6500' AGL.


Implementation of both new procedures in March, 2026.


Noise Events per Flight Movement
