

Updates at Calgary Airports

Airport of the Year!

Our Runway Safety Committee brings together pilots, air traffic controllers and airport teams to tackle airfield issues in real time. The committee's work includes:

- Identifying congestion points on taxiways and simplifying ground movements
- Monitoring runway surface conditions and sharing timely updates
- Improving communication flows so crews get the right info at the right time

Passenger Update

YYC Monthly Enplaned and Deplaned Passenger – Q3 2025

YYC experienced a record-breaking summer, surpassing 2 million passengers in each of July and August. The increase in passenger numbers was driven in part by WestJet's hub and spoke model, the Calgary Stampede and partnering with Tourism Calgary to welcome members of Rotary International with an additional 16.000 passengers. Per Tourism Calgary, the Rotary delegation added an additional \$100M to Calgary's GDP. Calgary Airports will continue to partner with Tourism Calgary to support large events coming to Calgary by providing such things as check-in stations, lounge access, welcome signage, parking, gift bags, etc.

A simpler security experience

Phase One of YYC's new Centralized Security Screening area is now open to guests travelling domestically out of YYC.

This universal design has been built for future demand and provides a calmer, more accessible journey for everyone.

These improvements reduce decision fatigue on your journey, both expanding and simplifying the passenger screening process for domestic travel.

Departing from YYC Calgary International Airport has just become easier!

What to expect for domestic travel



Centralized Screening

YYC's new centralized passenger screening combines 3 separate checkpoints into one efficient, modern and centrally located area

- Pass through one main security screening point (instead of choosing between multiple security checkpoints like A, B or C)
- 7 new lanes located between doors 4 and 6
- More space, clearer wayfinding

Centralized Screening

Designed with accessibility at the centre

- A dedicated accessibility queue laid out to allow more space for mobility devices
- Spaces with everyone in mind for those with both apparent and non-apparent disabilities





Centralized Screening

CATSA's enhanced CT X-ray technology, allows guests to:

- Keep electronics, including laptops, tablets and medical devices, in their bags
- Keep permitted liquids, aerosols and gels in their bags


































So what's next




Noise Analysis and Community Concerns


Lmax

 Metric for comparing acoustic events of different durations


SOUND PRESSURE LEVEL (SPL, dB) AT ONE MICROPHONE LOCATION

Lmax Average vs Maximum


Average vs Maximum Lmax per NMT Location March 2023 – February 2024





SEL Average vs Maximum







Total Leq During Different Project Phases




Lmax of Aircraft Noise Events During Different Project Phases



Noise Events per Flight Movement






Breakdown by Runway for Selected Timeframes




Breakdown Over Time for Selected Timeframes









Large & Captive Catchment Area

Year over Year GDP, Immigration, & Visitor Spend (2024 vs 2023)




Fastest Growing Province

International traffic grew at twice the rate of capacity in recent months




- YYC's International traffic has shown significant growth this past summer season
- Inbound International visitors to YYC up 6% year to date while rest of Canada down 1% vs 2024
- Only a 2% capacity increase to international markets loaded for summer 2026

Success Stories

Desirable routes drive market stimulation. Since 2019, each of the non-stop international routes we've launched boosted passenger numbers significantly after only one year. Sample routes below.


120% average market stimulation rate
