



YEAR 2 OVERALL CONSTRUCTION SCOPE


- Complete the rehabilitation of Runway 17R/35L pavement structures and visual aids (south of 11/29)
- New and upgraded approach lighting system, new runway centerline lights, touchdown lights, new exit taxiway centerline
- Upgrading electrical system to CAT II
- Revise Airfield Lighting Control and Monitoring System
- Complete power and communication work
- Complete storm management system improvements



COMMUNITY INFORMATION SESSIONS


Background and Session Details:

- Most are not worried about the upcoming 2025 work.















Western Runway Rehabilitation Operations





Mid-Construction Concerns Number of Distinct Households **December 2024 – March 2025**


