Committed to the growth and prosperity of the diverse communities on these traditional lands, YYC supports the lives, work, and leisure of those who inhabit and visit the areas we serve.











December 2023 – May 2024 YYC Update







YYC-Originating Passengers (previous 6 months)










2024 CONSTRUCTION | Phases 1-4 Overview





To date we have milled 15815.15 m³ of asphalt from the north end of the runway









CONCRETE REMOVAL WORK



Demolition of Concrete Threshold





YYC is one of two airports in Canada registered for Envision certification.


CONSTRUCTION	OPERATIONS AND PERFORMANCE	
Reduce construction waste : working to divert waste from landfill, potential re-use of materials at other airports.	Climate resiliency considerations: climate lens program from Infrastructure Canada, drainage and pavement designs.	
Balance earthworks: reuse of 80% of excavated material.	Upgraded runway safety features enabling long- term resilient.	
Reducing construction energy consumption: specialized equipment, anti-idling policy, sustainable transportation program.	LED Lighting and upgrades (energy conservation).	
Reduce potable water use through stormwater use during construction.	Rough-ins for future upgrades and needs to avoid intensive construction projects in the future (drainage, lighting).	
Community engagement: community info sessions and early consultation / engagement of on and off-site stakeholders.	Installation of paved shoulders and inset lighting for more efficient snow clearing (enabling better control of glycol-impacted snow).	
Noise monitoring: new noise monitoring terminals around the City for impacted communities.	Removal / remediation of contaminated materials encountered (e.g., wood-stave pipe, old dirt roads previously covered with oil).	
Standard project requirements : ECO Plan, HSE Plan, etc.





Runway Usage Trends






